These next few months will just fly for us as we've been so busy and it doesn't look like it is going to slow down.



will not receive any more newsletters from the committee. I urge you not to miss out on a once in a life time happening. It sure is hard to believe.... that some people are going to miss the Hemer



### Hemer - A Look Back

It has been 25 years since we stepped off the aircraft in Trenton. It was the end of three years of tangled emotions regarding life as a dependent of *Canadian Armed Forces in West Germany*. From my own perspective, upon our arrival on German soil to that Halloween night we boarded a plane for Canada, I ran a tumultuous race against normal growing experiences akin to everyone, versus those special circumstances the traveller finds himself engulfed in. We were at once children in a foreign land, but like all children we adapted quickly and handily to our new life. The children, it seemed, picked up the language quicker, the customs with vigour,

harbouring none of the post war fears of their elders. We just moved in and took over.

Of **Hemer**, the little hamlet nestled in a valley, the colour grey evokes much memory. The grey skies, the grey P.M.Q.'s, the little bit of grey snow we were endowed with every year, the grey suits the German women wore consistently. The next colour I remember was the Red and White school colours. Hemer Senior High School (HSHS) was a place to still be Canadian albeit with many Germany overtones. Here we met and befriended other children from various parts of Canada. Our teachers were as varied but as always the line between teacher and student was drawn and adhered to. The school allowed us a place for camaraderie and some measure of loyalty. There was fierce competition between Hemer, Soest and Werl schools, both on the playing fields and scholastically. Though we were all Brigade Schools in Europe we competed like our Football teams back home.

When I speak of fonder happier memories of Hemer I remember Kleine Canada and the Slop Shop next door. The latter was a much frequented "hang-out" for Canadian kids where they could grab a bag of chips and coke and just be who they were. The *M.L.S.*(Maple Leaf Services or latter know as Canex) had a great little candy counter full of enticing tooth decaying treats.

Later with the full onslaught of "Teenagery" there was Teentown. Dances with live bands and or Juke Boxes provided many a Friday or Saturday nights respite from routine. Dickman's Cookie factory, a summer job for those of us desperate for cold hard cash, gave us a backwards peek at the Industrial Revolution. Indeed those machines were so archaic and the system so undisciplined that we spent a happy summer of devil-may-care, hijinks with a pay cheque. Of the entire summer work experience as a factory labourer, I did come away with one profound promise to myself, that being, to get my education and never ever work that physically hard again. We grew up much faster, than our counter parts back home in Canada, not because we intended to, but more because we had to. We had to deal with things in life most children know very little of. A store clerk who would one day speak English, then the next day refuse by negating their ability to do so. A town that looked upon us as usurpers and a reminder always that they lost; a place where icecream was Ice-milk and Corn on the Cob was pig feed. We had a choice - sink or swim. Happily, we swam and took great pleasure and grew quickly because of our child-like adaptability and we always knew that this place would one day be just a memory, and so we make of the adversities, a happy memory.

Veterans of Hemer Senior School and <u>other local schools</u> come on out to Calgary in August 1991 to celebrate our memories, our friendships, our follies, and the passions of our youths.


The **Sandman Inn** is the Hotel that we have recommended. It is located right downtown in Calgary, just a few blocks from Mewata Armouries. The Armouries
